
Our Exams officer Mr Wilson kept the vital stats of this time:


112 exam sessions completed since 9th May 325,000 steps (fitbit) completed 232 km / 145 miles completed 2,507 exam papers distributed and completed





From here, one class went along to their Interactive Forces Workshop which involved discussions and investigations exploring how forces are used in Theme Park rides.

Wrong Trousers Day


Swallowdale School Council organised for us to take part in Wallace and Gromit's 'The Wrong Trousers Day' on Friday 21st June. Children


Amazing Achievements


Year 6 Girls Football Team

> The Summer Term is always busy with Sporting Events and Sports Days. We had 56 children take part in the Loughborough Town Sports with great success in the 200m and throwing events.


In the North Charnwood Quad Kids there were medal wins for our Y3/4 and Y5/6 team.
